Notes from Pastor Tim.....

"He does not faint or grow weary. His understanding is unsearchable." -Isaiah 40:28

"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts. -Isaiah 55:8-9

These are indeed but the outskirts of his ways; and how small a whisper do we hear of him! But the thunder of his power who can understand?' - Job 26:14

When I look at the heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established; what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them? -Psalm 8:3-4

Worship at the church I attended on the Sunday morning of our Family Service in September focused on the identity of Jesus. "Who do you say that I am?" The preacher quoted Jesus' famous question to his disciples and suggested that it was a question for us as well. In fact, he suggested that it is the most important question we'll ever be asked.

Whether or not that's true, I do think the question matters. It effects how we think about God and how we relate to God, which in turn effects how we think about ourselves and how we relate to the world around us.

Lately, I can't escape thoughts of the vastness of God – a God who is endless and infinite, timeless, uncreated, uncontained, unrestricted, without shape or limits, utterly beyond: beyond words, beyond comprehension,

beyond imagination. This God is a dynamic wisdom and power, which the human mind cannot fathom. It is the God pointed to in the scriptures above.

The advantage of this God is the divine capacity to do and be more than what humans can create for ourselves. A God who is utterly beyond us is also utterly bigger and better than us – a God whose dreams for us exceed our own dreams, a God whose purpose for us is greater than we might imagine, a God whose wisdom puts our lives in the context of a holy agenda, which we can trust without fully grasping.

However, when this image of God alone dominates my thinking there's an intimacy that I'm missing. A vast, unsearchable God is also an unreachable, impersonal God. I don't know how to access this God, find hope in or be known by this God.

Here is where Jesus' question becomes so important for me. You are God incarnate, God made flesh; you are the Infinite made immanent and personal; you show us who God is; you reveal to us God's heart; you embody God's love; you show us its will to claim us, heal us, grow us and live through us. You bring the vast unsearchable wisdom of the Eternal into an assurance that is intimate, knows our names, and is undeterred by the obstacles that we, or this world, put in the way.

"Who do you say that I am?" asks Jesus. I hope you will think about my answer. I hope you will think about your own. Let's talk about these things.

There are additional teams that are forming this year for ongoing projects.

evening TCC will have a 5 PM family service followed by a fellowship dinner. Each month a family is needed to host this dinner. Online sign-ups for food and help with set-up are posted on the website. The host needs to monitor the sign-ups through our website and find people to fill in any gaps. The host for that month can also "decorate" the social hall in a theme (optional). The host will set out the buffet during the last 15 minutes of service and oversee clean-up. All paper goods are provided.

~The Charitable Gift Fair - Once again TCC will partner with Nourish Bridgeport to hold a Charitable Christmas on November 23rd. This year a holiday concert will follow in the sanctuary. Deb Rosati will head up the team, but she needs several people to help her organize and execute this special day. There a various level of commitment, from volunteering that day to helping Deb in the planning and set-up.

~Ash Garden - One or two people are needed to help with maintenance of the Ash Garden for the upcoming year (primarily weeding, trimming the hedges, and adding mulch). Another individual is needed to promote the Ash Garden, working in conjunction with the leadership board to update the fee scale, coordinating with Ministry Fulfillment to promote it online and make it know to our members.

<u>~Stewardship Team -</u> This group will design and execute our spring stewardship campaign under the guidance of the leadership board. Members of this team will set their own meeting schedule from February to May, with at least one representative attending February's leadership meeting. The campaign usually culminates with a fellowship event which this team will oversee.

Exciting news! We have signed the covenant with nOURish BRIDGEPORT! At our family service on Sept 19, Reverend Sara and a student from the ESL class attended the service to kick off our commitment to each other to serve our neighbors in need. After the presentation, all attending signed the covenant.

The covenant is included below. It is in general terms, but we have made specific commitments. We have committed to provide help on the third Thursday of each month at the Feel the Warmth Community Suppers, and to provide tutors and child care help for the ESL (English as a Second Language) program.

While this is a covenant between TCC and nOURish BRIDGEPORT (NB), we encourage everyone to invite friends and family to also be involved. We are looking to get community involvement, to show the community that we are here to serve others, and to potentially expand our TCC family.

In addition to the Thursday night commitment, there are other opportunities to serve, such as the Food pantry (providing supplies or helping at the center), Outdoor market during the summer (held Saturday mornings), Overnight Emergency Shelter (held during the winter). In the coming months, the NB team will be identifying some opportunities to help if you can't attend at their locations.

A Note from the Treasurer: **Pledges**

The lifeblood of our church is our pledges. Pledges are, by far, our largest source of income (about 2/3 of it); they allow us to continue to do God's work for ourselves and others.

Our 2019 fiscal year ended on August 31 with the church sustaining a \$36,600 loss for the year. Most notably, while expenses were in line with the budget, Pledge Contributions fell \$10.800 short of the amount pledged. While it's understandable that people are not thinking about truing-up pledge commitments in August, as opposed to at the end of the calendar year, 38 of our 67 pledge "units" (for lack of a better term) did not meet their pledged amount.

We will be mailing 2019 Fiscal Year-End Contribution Statements in the next week or so. If you are short of your pledged amount, please make every effort to become current. When making such a contribution, note in the memo line that the payment is for "fiscal year 2019 pledge" so we can keep our records straight.

As we enter fiscal year 2020 (September 1 – August 31), we continue to be faced with financial challenges. Last Sunday, the congregation approved a budget showing an expected \$48,000 loss for the year. We continue to rely on the returns from our investments to make up part of our deficits, but investment returns do not cover the entire shortfall and we will continue to see our endowment shrink.

So, while our pledge campaign for this year has formally ended, it is never too late! If you've pledged in the past and haven't done so this year, or have never pledged before, simply contact Pastor Tim, Jodi or myself, or send a note to the office, with your wishes regarding making a pledge for 2020.
